United Way helps fund Dalton Area Project

"This ramp will enable her to go outside for the first time in years," Grace Anderson said of the impact of her volunteer service. "I am part of a team who is building a ramp for a wheelchair-bound woman in our community.'

Anderson is a rising sophomore at Dalton High School and just one of the 200-plus youth who volunteered for the Dalton Area Project (DAP), funded in part by a \$10,000 United Way of Northwest Georgia grant. The grant helped with home repairs for 15 families in Whitfield and Murray counties, including the elderly and those with chronic illnesses.

Projects included renovations in bathrooms and kitchens, building porches, outside landscaping and building wheelchair ramps for the disabled.

"Instead of doing a service project elsewhere, it's rewarding to give back in your own community right next door," said Fletcher Griffin, a local high school sophomore.

The United Way grant provided funding for construction supplies and home

repairs. United Way's Safe Home Initiative impacts individuals' basic needs by reducing the long-term need for food, housing and utility assistance.

While some of the youth are new to service, others have been involved with DAP for the past several years. All took away value from the experience. Clay Walker, a rising seventhgrader, was excited to learn useful skills like "how to use power tools," but he was very proud to have helped a local family by rebuilding their rotted porch.

Micah Riggle, a United Way board member and DAP project leader, said, "Seeing today's youth work

together to improve the lives of those in our community is exciting. It's an honor to see United Way and DAP collaborate to help reduce the long-term needs of those in our community."

Area youth volunteers endured the heat to change local lives in this project which was led by Nate Juvinall from Dalton First United Methodist Church.

Ken Renz, a United Way volunteer and DAP project leader, said, "Seeing these kids work together to accomplish something that is greater than themselves has been so rewarding. They are making great things happen in our com-
