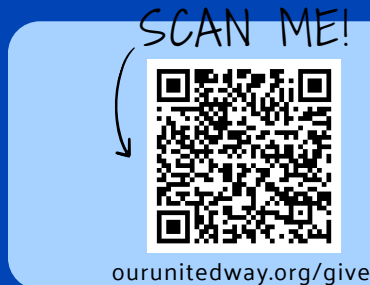


from surviving → to thriving

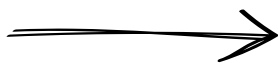
