Achieving financial stability requires that you and your family's basic needs are met so that you can plan and save for your goals or unexpected expenses. But for too many in Whitfield and Murray counties, impossible choices, like deciding between food, rent, or medicine, are a daily concern.

Connecting our neighbors to help and hope

In Whitfield County, 17% of households live below the federal poverty level, and another 30% are ALICE (Asset-Limited, Income-Constrained, Employed) hard-working families who earn above the poverty line but still struggle to afford essentials like housing, food, and healthcare. In Murray County, 13% of households live in poverty, and another 28% are ALICE. These families are working hard but can't afford the basic necessities of life. The need is clear: many of the calls to our 211 helpline are from people seeking help with basic necessities.
