Read United is a year-round effort to boost childhood literacy in Whitfield and Murray counties, helping kids build the reading skills they need to succeed in school and life.



goLEAD is a three-day leadership program that empowers teens to spark real community change. In partnership with UGA's J.W. Fanning Institute, it builds skills in Leadership, Education, and Development.



Born Learning Trails are 10 bilingual signs and activities that turn park visits into fun, skill-building activities to support early childhood development.



Youth United Council is a signature United Way leadership program that empowers teens to lead with purpose. It uses UGA's "Youth Leadership in Action" curriculum to inspire the next generation.
